

What can I throw away?

Large appliances require a special pick up request for removal. Please contact us to schedule.

Asbestos is a hazardous chemical that cannot be discarded in your trash or recycling receptacle. Contact your local landfill for disposal options.

We cannot collect asphalt in our curbside collection trucks. Please contact us about scheduling a roll-off dumpster to collect this type of material at your location.

A special pick up is required to remove bathtubs from your home. Contact us to request a special pick up of your dishwasher.

Alkaline batteries (single-use batteries) are okay to discard in your trash can, as they are no longer manufactured with dangerous chemicals like mercury or lead. Lithium ion, nickel cadmium and other rechargeable batteries should be recycled at your local battery recycler. Never place these batteries in your trash or recycling receptacle.

Beds, mattresses and frames require a special pick up request. Please contact us to schedule pickup.

Large nuts, bolts or screws should never be placed in your recycling bin. They are damaging to the equipment that processes your recyclables. Please discard this type of material in your regular household trash container or contact a local scrap metal recycler for proper disposal.

We cannot collect bricks in our curbside collection trucks.

Acetone is a hazardous chemical that cannot be disposed of in your trash or recycling receptacle. Contact your local landfill for disposal options.

Never discard acid in any form in your trash or recycling receptacle. Contact your local landfill or household hazardous waste disposal center for disposal options.

Aerosols containing hazardous chemicals must be discarded at a household hazardous waste drop-off location. Contact your local landfill for disposal options.

A special pick up is required to remove air conditioners from your home. Freon must be removed prior to collection. Contact us to request a special pick up of your air conditioner.

Alkaline batteries (single-use batteries) are okay to discard in your trash can, as they are no longer manufactured with dangerous chemicals like mercury or lead.

Dead animals can never be discarded in your trash or recycling receptacle. Please contact your local landfill or animal control office for disposal options.

Animal waste should be discarded in your trash collection container. Please make sure to bag the animal waste before placing in your collection container.

Antifreeze is a hazardous chemical that cannot be discarded in your trash or recycling receptacle. Contact your local landfill for disposal options.

Always place cartons in your recycling bin. Cartons contain a recyclable layer of paperboard underneath their plastic coating.

We cannot collect building debris in our curbside collection trucks.

A special pick up request is required to collect your old cabinetry. Please contact us to schedule pickup.

Cables should never be placed in your recycling bin. Please discard this type of material in your regular household trash container or contact a certified e-waste collector in your area for proper disposal.

Caps can be left on or off of your recyclables prior to placing in your recycling bin.

Car batteries can never be discarded in your trash or recycling bin. Please contact your local landfill or auto body shop for disposal options.

Always place cardboard in your recycling bin. If the boxes do not fit inside your bin, please make sure to flatten them for ease of collection.

A special pick up is required to remove carpet from your home. Contact us to request a special pick up!

Despite being made from plastic, CDs should never be placed in your recycling bin. Please contact a certified e-waste collection provider or discard in your regular household trash container.

Cell Phones should not be discarded in your waste or recycling receptacle. The lithium ion batteries contained within the cell phone have the potential to combust or ignite inside of our trucks or at disposal facilities. Please return these products to a certified electronics recycler.

We cannot collect large volumes of ceramic tiles in our curbside collection trucks.

Ceramic cups, plates or bowls should be discarded in your household trash can. They should never be placed in your recycling bin.

A large volume of ceramic tile or renovation waste, however, is best collected by calling our office for specialized pickup.

Always place paperboard (ex. cereal boxes and frozen food boxes) in your recycling bin.

Never discard hazardous chemicals of any type in your waste or recycling receptacle. Contact your local landfill for disposal options.

Textiles cannot be recycled in your single stream recycling bin. Please donate to a used clothing drop off location or discard old textiles in your trash collection container.

Compact fluorescent lightbulbs contain hazardous chemicals that cannot be discarded in your waste or recycling receptacle. Contact your local landfill for disposal options.

Computers should be brought to a certified e-waste recycler. Computers should never be placed in your recycling or trash collection container.

We cannot collect concrete in our curbside collection trucks. Please also be aware that this includes concrete in dry powder form. Contact your local landfill for disposal options or consider utilizing our roll-off dumpster service for large amounts of renovation waste.

We do not currently provide a shredding service for classified or confidential documents. If you would like to have your confidential documents shredded, please contact your local landfill or specialty provider for the collection of these items.

We cannot collect construction debris in our curbside collection trucks. Please consider utilizing our roll-off dumpster service for large amounts of renovation or construction waste.

Place used cooking oil **MUST BE** placed in small amounts in a sealable container prior to discarding in your regular household trash container. Should you have a larger volume of cooking oil to discard, please contact your local landfill for disposal options.

A special pick up is required to remove scrap metal from your home. Contact us to request a special pick up of your dishwasher.

Dead animals can never be discarded in your trash or recycling bin. Please contact your local landfill or animal control office for disposal options

Humidifiers are classified as '**white goods**' which require a special pick up for removal from your home. Contact us to request a special pick up of your dehumidifier.

A special pick up is required to remove furniture from your home. Contact us to request a special pick up of your furniture.

Always place diapers in your trash collection container. Never place diapers in your recycling bin.

We cannot collect dirt in our curbside collection trucks. Please contact your local landfill or landscaping company for disposal options.

Dishwashers are classified as 'white goods' which require a special pick up for removal from your home. Contact us to request a special pick up of your dishwasher.

A special pick up is required to remove an old door from your home. Contact us to request a special pick up of your door.

Dryers are classified as 'white goods' which require a special for removal from your home. Contact us to request a special pick up of your dryer.

A special pick up is required to remove drywall from your home. Contact us to request a special pick up of your drywall.

E-Waste (cellphones, TVs, computers, laptops, keyboards, fax machines, copiers, etc.) should be brought to a certified e-waste collection provider for proper recycling.

However, because a DVD player contains no dangerous chemicals, it is OK to place in your regular household trash for disposal.

E-Waste (cellphones, TVs, computers, laptops, keyboards, fax machines, copiers, etc.) should be brought to a certified e-waste collection provider for proper recycling.

Egg cartons that are made from paper should be placed in your recycling bin. Egg cartons that are made from foam plastic should be discarded of in your trash collection container.

E-Waste (cellphones, TVs, computers, laptops, keyboards, fax machines, copiers, etc.) should be brought to a certified e-waste collection provider for proper recycling.

However, if your small electrical appliance does not contain any dangerous chemicals, it is OK to place in your regular household trash for disposal. Please contact us about scheduling a special pick up for large electrical appliances.

E-Waste (cellphones, TVs, computers, laptops, keyboards, fax machines, copiers, etc.) should be brought to a certified e-waste collection provider for proper recycling.

Explosives are dangerous materials that cannot cannot be disposed of in your waste or recycling receptable. Contact your local landfill for disposal options.

Textiles cannot be recycled in your single stream recycling bin. Please donate to a used clothing drop off location or discard in your trash collection container.

Never discard hazardous chemicals of any type in your waste or recycling receptacle. Contact your local landfill for disposal options.

A special pick up is required to remove fiberglass from your home. Please double bag any fiberglass prior to setting this material at the curb for collection Contact us to request a special pick up of your fiberglass.

If your fireworks have been used, please allow up to 24 hours before discarding them in your trash collection container. They must be fully extinguished and cooled prior to disposal. Never place used fireworks in your recycling bin.

If you have unused fireworks, please contact your local landfill for disposal.

Flexible packaging (ex. wrappers, squeezable pouches, laundry detergent pods) cannot be recycled at this time. Please discard this type of material in your regular household trash container.

There is currently no specialty organics food waste collection program in your area. Food waste should be discarded in your regular household trash collection container.

Freezers are classified 'white goods' which require a special pick up for removal from your home. Contact us to request a special pick up of your dishwasher.

Freon is a hazardous chemical that cannot be discarded in your waste or recycling receptacle. Contact a local vendor to remove this material before your large appliances can be collected by Fulton Sanitation & Recycling, LLC.

Always place paperboard (ex. cereal boxes and frozen food boxes) in your recycling bin.

Fuel oil is a hazardous material that cannot be discarded in your waste or recycling receptacle. Contact your local landfill for disposal options.

Fungicide is a hazardous material that cannot be discarded in your waste or recycling receptacle. Contact your local landfill for disposal options.

A special pick up request is needed for the removal of furniture from your location. Please contact us to schedule.

Gasoline should never be placed in your trash or recycling collection container. Please contact your local landfill for disposal options.

Always place glass bottles in your recycling bin. Mirrors and heat-resistant glass must be discarded in your trash collection container.

****Excludes glass bottles in Georgia***

Glue should always be discarded in your trash collection container.

Grass should be placed at the curb on your regular yard waste collection day. Grass clippings should be collected in either a personal container marked 'yard waste' or in biodegradable lawn bags. While, clear plastic bags are an acceptable method for collection at this time, they do cause issues at the facility that composts your yard waste. We will accept up to 3 bags.

For an alternative, more eco-friendly method for grass clipping disposal, consider leaving your grass clippings on your lawn in order to replenish the nutrients in the soil, ensuring a healthy-looking lawn.

For larger quantities of yard waste, please contact your local landfill or landscaping company for disposal options.

Place grease in a sealable container prior to discarding in your regular household trash container.

Grass, leaves, branches and brush should be placed at the curb on your regular yard waste collection day.

Yard waste should be collected in either a personal container marked 'yard waste' or in biodegradable lawn bags. While, clear plastic bags are an acceptable method for collection at this time, they do cause issues at the facility that composts your yard waste. We will accept up to 3 bags and 3 bundles.

For an alternative, more eco-friendly method for yard waste disposal, considering starting your own backyard compost pile.

For larger quantities of yard waste, please contact your local landfill or landscaping company for disposal options.

Grocery bags should never be placed in your recycling bin. They create a lot of damage at the facility that processes your recyclables. Instead, bring plastic bags back to the grocery store or big box store for proper recycling. You may also place plastic bags in your trash collection container for disposal.

Always place books (paperback & hardback) in your recycling bin. Visit our recycling page for more information.

We cannot collect helium or propane tanks. Please contact your local landfill for safe disposal options

Please rinse cartons before placing in your recycling bin. Cartons contain a reusable layer of paperboard underneath their plastic coating.

A special pick up is required to remove insulation from your home. Please double bag any insulation prior to setting this material at the curb for collection. Contact us to request a special pick up of your insulation.

Always place cartons in your recycling bin. Cartons contain a recyclable layer of paperboard underneath their plastic coating.

Always place junk mail in your recycling bin. Visit our recycling page for more information.

Please place small amounts of kitty litter in plastic grocery bags prior to placing in your trash container for disposal. If this practice requires multiple bags, please place these bags outside of your trash container on your normal trash collection day. This helps avoid your trash collection container from becoming too heavy.

Printer and ink cartridges can be discarded in your regular household trash. Never place these items in your recycling bin.

In order to be collected with your curbside trash collection, paint (of any kind) **must be completely dried**. You may mix your paint with kitty litter in order to speed up this process. Contact your local landfill for alternative methods of disposal.

A special pick up is required to remove large items such as a lawn mower from your home. Contact us to request a special pick up of your lawn mower.

For an alternative, more eco-friendly method for yard waste disposal, considering starting your own backyard compost pile.

For greater quantities of yard waste, please contact your local landfill or landscaping company for disposal options.

Non-mercury containing light bulbs may be discarded with your regular household trash. Light Bulbs should never be placed in your recycling bin. Please contact your local landfill for disposal of compact fluorescent bulbs.

Lithium ion batteries (often found within cell phones, laptops and cameras) are dangerous as they contain hazardous chemicals and metals that cannot be discarded in your waste or recycling receptacle. They have been known to cause fires within our trucks or at disposal centers. Bring old lithium ion batteries to a battery recycler or contact your local landfill for disposal options.

Always place magazines in your recycling bin. Visit our recycling page for more information. Beds, mattresses and frames require a special pick up request. Please contact us to schedule.

We suggest collecting all used needles and syringes in a thick, impenetrable plastic bottle (ex. laundry detergent bottle). The sealed bottle can then be discarded in your regular household trash container. The plastic container is no longer recyclable once it has been used for the collection of medical waste.

For unused prescription medications, please contact your pharmacy for proper disposal. Prescriptions should never be placed in your trash or recycling container for disposal.

We suggest collecting all used needles and syringes in a thick, impenetrable plastic bottle (ex. laundry detergent bottle). The sealed bottle can then be discarded in your regular household trash container. The plastic container is no longer recyclable once it has been used for the collection of medical waste.

For unused prescription medications, please contact your pharmacy for proper disposal. Prescriptions should never be placed in your trash or recycling container for disposal.
